RISK MANAGEMENT AT BUSH PLAY

On-site Risk Management and Insurance Matters

Prior to the commencement of each session at Bush Play we spend 5-10 minutes in discussion, focusing on how we'll keep ourselves and others safe whilst playing in the bush. There will be reminders about our emergency signal and protocol, snake and insect awareness, our physical boundaries and safe play. We'll talk about the day's location and relevant weather information, e.g "Are we in a tree-filled zone or an open-air zone?".

I have created and completed a full risk-benefit assessment of our property which you are free to view.

I am insured by ANSVAR for Public Liability Insurance and you and your children are insured whilst here. This does not include ambulance cover, that is an individual responsibility.

I have employed a Registered Arborist who has inspected and audited every space we occupy. I have created our play spaces based on his assessment of the trees.

We will have a couple of basic shelters for weather such as severe hail, but the philosophy behind outdoor play is to get outside. If the weather is too severe according to the Bureau of Meteorology, (lightning, hail storms or severe wind) I will cancel the session and a make-up session will be available.

I am aware, as a hills resident, bushfire risk is present. We have a bushfire safety evacuation plan in place that will be displayed and visible to all visitors at Bush Play.

I have emergency contact numbers in visible locations for the case of emergency. It is recommended that all adults have a fully-charged phone on them at all times.
